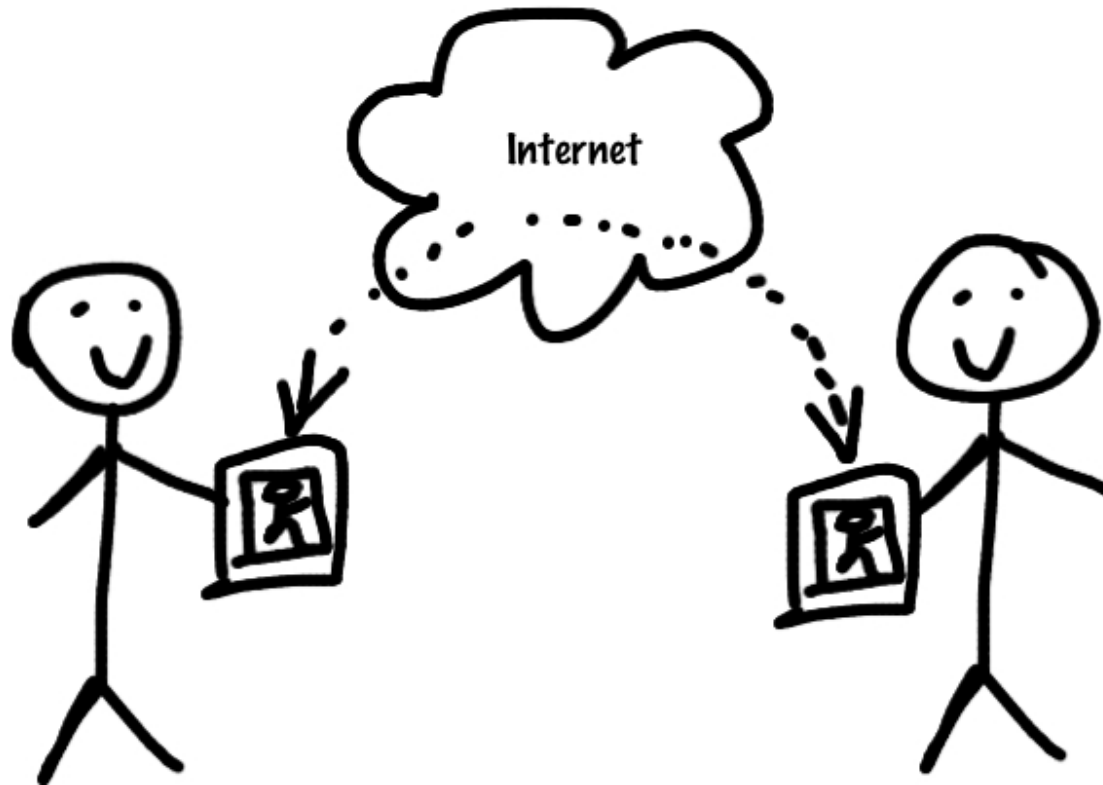
Who to trust
